Internships at the JURASSICA Museum Research / Collections / Museography

The JURASSICA Museum in Porrentruy (Canton of Jura, Switzerland) is offering a limited number of internships for MSc students to gain practical experience in one or several aspects of work in a natural history museum.

The typical internship will last from one to three months, depending on the subject and the student's availability. Subjects can span from research-related projects (possibly including fieldwork activities) to the curation of natural history collections and the development of new exhibitions (museography). The Museum will cover part of the expenses associated with the internship.

Internships may entitle students to accumulate credits (ECTS) as part of their MSc program.

Research

The JURASSICA Museum host an academic unit in geosciences whose main research activities focus mostly on regional paleontology. As far as possible and depending on the student's centers of interest, internship subjects will be integrated to ongoing research projects and some may also include fieldwork activities.



Collections

The JURASSICA Museum is a natural history museum with rich zoological, botanical, geological, and paleontological collections notably documenting regional natural heritage. Collection internships may range from collection management to specimen preparation and restoration.



Museography

In addition to permanent exhibitions, the JURASSICA Museum organizes two temporary exhibitions per year as well as different public outreach activities. Museography internships will allow students to gain practical experience by participating in the development of a temporary exhibition or a new public outreach program.
